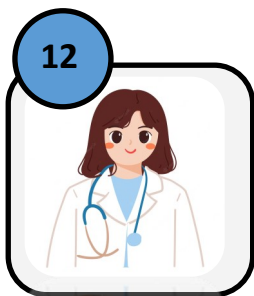
So, who stole the cake and where is it now? Detective, below is the information you need— can you find the cake thief and save the day? Hurry!

Get to work, detective! **Follow the instructions below.** Each one will lead you to a piece of information that matches either one of the suspects or one of the locations. Cross off the person/location as you work through the tasks.

You should be left with one person and one location....send your solution to the Library team on [trust.library@nhs.net](mailto:trust.library@nhs.net) by **Monday 3 July 2023** to be in with a chance to win a £20 book token!

1. Go to the [Library Catalogue](#) In the box where it says **Library Catalogue**, click the arrow to reveal the drop down list of options. Choose **Title**. Type in **"exploding teeth"** (just do it, OK?) Click on **Go** on the right hand side. This will give you a book title. Look at the record and find the **ISBN**—the last two numbers will correspond with one of the suspects...cross this person off your list.

2. Watch our [short video](#) on the 5 steps you need to take to get the most out of our service and resources—it's less than 3 minutes. Add together the maximum number of books that registered Library members may borrow and the number of light bulbs you can see on the Step 5 slide. Cross off the suspect with the corresponding number.

3. Check out our [Padlet of Padlets](#)—how many Padlets are on there? Cross off the suspect with the corresponding number.



To view a Padlet, just click on the icon to access a great range of useful links, videos and graphics.

4. Visit the [Library Hub](#). Click on **Start your search**. If you have an Athens account, click on the yellow bar at the top of the page and enter your login details. If not, you can register [here](#). Once you're in, click on **Advanced Search**. In the first box, select **Title** from the drop down box and type or copy and paste **"Improving feedback on junior doctors' prescribing errors: mixed-methods evaluation of a quality improvement project"** In the next box, select **Author** from the drop down box and type **Reynolds**. Click on **Search**. You should have an article from BMJ Quality and Safety. Click on **Get PDF** to retrieve the full text. Scroll to the last page and note down the last two digits of the page number. Cross off the matching number attached to one of the suspects.

So, now you have the identity of the culprit....but where is the cake? Follow the instructions below to eliminate locations until you are left with the right one!

1. Go to the [Catalogue](#). In the box where it says Library Catalogue, click the arrow to reveal the drop down list of options. Choose **Title**. Type in **“pig wrestling”** Yes, really! It worked last time, didn't it? Click on **Go** on the right hand side. Look at the Publication details and note the last two digits of the date given. Cross off the location with the corresponding number.

2. While you've got the Catalogue on the screen, look top left, and click on **Lists**. This will open a window headed **Public lists**. Click on **View all**. Scroll down to the bottom of the first page, and click on the number **3**. Look for **Medway Maritime Hospital—Mindfulness** and click on it. How many titles are in the list? Cross off the location with the corresponding number.



Look top right to see **Log in to your account**. Click and type in your membership number (on your Library card, beginning KMD) and password to enable all sorts of features such as placing a reservation, saving your own lists and suggesting a title for purchase. 3. Head over to our [YouTube channel](#). Along the top, click on **Playlists** and find **Fun technology**. Click on **View full playlist**. Scroll down the list and look for the **QR Code Monkey Tutorial**. What number in the list is this video? Cross off the location with the corresponding number.

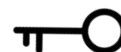

4. Go to [BMJ Case Reports](#) and type in **Abkur Boucher stroke**. Press **Return** or click on the **magnifying glass** to search. This should give you an article entitled *“When it matters that a ‘stroke’ is not a stroke”*. **Click on the title**. Down the left-hand side you will see a number of options—find **Citation Tools** and click. At the bottom of the window look at the **Cite this article as** information. What are the last two digits of the citation? Cross off the corresponding location.
